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2.3	Digital Health Capabilities	11.20-11.30
Description	Benchmark survey to measure digital health capabilities from an end-user perspective: a Delphi Study Invited speaker: Dr Joe Zhang, Imperial College London <i>Item proposed by Angela Burgin</i>	
Purpose	To provide information to the group about the study and explore opportunities for involvement	
Outcomes	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Moving into the next stage of the project, recruiting HCPs (including pharmacists). The purpose of the project is to consider specific functions of digital health systems to ensure that HCPs are able to provide the safest and best quality care for patients; it covers areas, e.g. shared care records. • A survey has been created to support the systemisation of the collection of data; it will involve doctors, nurses and pharmacists and will cover primary and secondary care. Looking to recruit 10 expert and non-expert pharmacists, from across the whole of pharmacy, to a Delphi panel which will review the questions and contribute to the final survey; it is envisaged that the work involved will take approximately 8 hours over 2-3 months and, in return, panel members will be credited on the final document. The Delphi process is scheduled to start at the beginning of May. • It was confirmed that, although the project is focussed on England, the intention is for it to be rolled out across the whole of GB. <p>➤ RJ to contact Angela B off-line re: Delphi Panel when project is rolled out across GB.</p>

PRSB project on over-prescribing - update
