<b>Description</b>	RPS Professional Standards for Hospital Pharmacy Standards 2022 Refresh
<b>Purpose</b>	To provide an update on progress of the refresh of the RPS Professional Standards for Hospital Pharmacy Services including the first Task & Finish Group and feedback from meeting
	<p>Sarah provided an update on her ongoing role as a consultant to complete the Hospital Standards refresh, recapping on the background and process used to refresh the hospital standards.</p> <p>Sarah confirmed the current status and aim to finalise and be published for the RPS annual conference in November.</p> <p>Sarah described substantial progress in designing a new self-assessment or peer assessment tool and invited HEAG to test the use of the tool against the new standards as a priority. The offer is open wider to any networks HEAG might wish to share with.</p> <p><b>ACTION:</b> HEAG members to contact Sarah if they wish to test the new self-assessment tool and refreshed standards.</p>

<b>Description</b>	<p>The Commonwealth Pharmacists Association are expanding their <a href="#">Commonwealth Partnerships for AMS programme</a>, building on the successful African/UK health partnerships established through phase 1.</p> <p>Traditionally, these types of grants are awarded to medical and nursing staff, and in this case of the funding hosted by CPA, funding will only be awarded to applicants who demonstrate pharmacists being in leadership roles within the proposed projects.</p> <p>A call will be going out to UK pharmacists to submit an application for projects to form part of this phase 2 of the programme.</p>
